#### **CHAPTER V**

#### CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

#### 5.1 Conclusion

This study examined Face Threatening Acts (FTAs) in the film The Glass Castle to see how they reflect dysfunctional family communication. Using the theory from Brown and Levinson (1987), Olson's (2000) Circumplex Model, and Cutting and Fordyce's (2020) context theory, the writer find 70 examples of FTAs in the dialogue between family members. From all the data showing types of face-threatening acts, positive face-threatening acts are more dominantly found in the dialogue of *The Glass Castle* movie. The results show that both types of FTAs appear often, showing that the Walls family communication often damages respect and limits personal freedom.

The analysis also showed four strategies used to perform FTAs, which are bald on record, positive politeness, negative politeness, and off record. The most common strategy was bald on record, which shows that the Walls family often speaks directly and bluntly, especially during conflicts. Positive politeness and negative politeness appeared less often, meaning there were fewer efforts to reduce the impact of the words. Off record was the least used, showing that indirect speech is rare in their interactions.

According to Olson (2000), the FTAs in the film match patterns of low cohesion, chaotic flexibility, and poor communication. The family members show emotional distance, inconsistent roles, and a lack of supportive conversation. These findings show that FTAs are not only about language but also reveal deeper problems in relationships. This supports earlier research that links poor communication patterns with ongoing family conflict.

### **5.2 Suggestion**

From the results of this research, there are several suggestions. First, future researchers can study Face Threatening Acts (FTAs) in different films, books, or real-life conversations to compare the patterns found in this study. They can also analyze more data or focus on other aspects, such as how FTAs affect people's feelings. Second, for those studying family communication, it will be helpful to combine language analysis with psychology or sociology. This can give a better picture of how words and speech affect family relationships. Lastly, for everyday life, this research is a reminder to choose words carefully when talking to family members. Avoiding harsh or hurtful speech and using more polite and supportive words can help keep family relationships better.
