#### **CHAPTER V**

## **CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION**

#### 5.1 Conclusion

Based on the findings and discussion in the previous chapter, the writer concludes that there are 51 utterances found in the movie *Expend4bles* (2023) that reflect different language styles: formal style (20 data), consultative style (10 data), casual style (15 data), and intimate style (6 data). Formal style is the most frequently employed, reflecting the film's focus on strategic teamwork, professional conflict, and the need for precise coordination. This style fits situations where the speakers have moderate familiarity and need to exchange important or sensitive information.

In addition to the language style, the writer also analyses the social factors based on Janet Holmes' theory, including participants, setting, topic, and function. From the findings, it is concluded that the most influential factor affecting the choice of language style is the participants specifically, the relationship between the speaker and the listener. When the speakers share close emotional ties, the language tends to be more casual or intimate. In contrast, when the participants have a professional or distant relationship, the language used becomes more formal or consultative. Other social factors such as the topic being discussed, and the function or purpose of the utterance also play a role in shaping the language style used by the characters.

In conclusion, the movie *Expend4bles* (2023) demonstrates a wide range of language styles that reflect both the action-packed and emotional dimensions of the story. The findings of this research show that language choice in the film is influenced by social context and interpersonal relationships, making Martin Joos' and Janet Holmes' theories highly relevant in understanding how language functions in dynamic interactions.

## **5.2 Suggestion**

This study has several limitations, but the writer suggests that future researchers and readers develop a deeper understanding of the various language styles used in action-themed films, especially those involving military contexts such as *Expend4bles* (2023). Although this study successfully categorized 51 utterances into four out of five language styles based on Martin Joos's theory: formal, consultative, casual, and intimate the scope was limited to main characters only and to one movie. Future research is recommended to examine a broader range of characters or analyze more scenes to provide a more comprehensive understanding. It is also suggested that future researchers analyze language styles using other sociolinguistic approaches or combine Joos's theory with other frameworks to enrich the findings. Moreover, the application of Holmes's social factors could be expanded further to explore the deeper interplay between participants, setting, topic, and function in shaping language use.

For future studies, the writer advises researchers to investigate language styles in different genres of films, television series, or even real-life conversations such as interviews, debates, or speeches. It would also be beneficial to analyze the differences in language style use between male and female characters or between protagonists and antagonists. Ultimately, the writer hopes that this research will serve as a reference and valuable source for students and scholars who wish to explore the dynamics of language style in various forms of media and communication.
